# Smallholder banned from keeping animals

A man who caused suffering to goats, ferrets and poultry by failing to properly care for them on his smallholding in North Dorset has been prosecuted and banned from keeping any animals for 10 years after Dorset Council's Trading Standards investigated reports of animal cruelty and brought charges against the individual.

### **Dorset Innovation Park**
