754	<p>Dorset Council Cranborne Chase Councillor Piers Brown.</p> <p>Cllr Brown reported on a meeting held on 20/10/20 Cllr Cherry Brook Lead Member - Highways and Cllr Colin Taylor. The poor state of the lower end of the High Street and the pavement along Common Road were acknowledged. All indications suggest that repairs/maintenance will take place next year, firm dates to follow shortly.</p> <p>Dorset Council announced availability of Leisure & Development grants to assist with arts & leisure projects to get off the ground.</p> <p>Dorset Council preparations for a 2nd wave are ongoing offering welfare checks and Covid19 support network. Winter pressure on the system and focus on how to manage adult social care with fewer numbers going into care homes.</p>	

	<p>Following a long period of vacancy the County Owned Burley Road Farm is being offered to let as a Dairy Unit. The farm includes a three bedroom farmhouse and the farmstead houses a modern milking parlour, dairy, a range of buildings and large modern slurry store. Dorset Council are offering a 10 year Farm Business Tenancy to the successful applicant, to commence on 25 March 2021.</p> <p>Whilst acknowledging County Farm's announcement is good news members remain concerned about how long it has taken to recruit new tenants and the amount of revenue that has been lost during this period. Concerns that damage to a storage barn roof whilst removing valuable silage bales / nutrients seems also to have been overlooked.</p>
