507	Recreation Ground Maintenance Work	
	During the planning and preparation for the Recreation Ground's boundary hedge works the Council received two similar price indications and confirmation of appropriate hourly rates for this type of job (which was reassuring for the members – as on this occasion the Council were unable to source 3 separate quotes). Due to restricted scheduling dates for this type of work the Council agreed to proceed with a local contractor.	
	Members resolved unanimously to approve £1500.00 expenditure to commence coppicing of the boundary hedge between the football pitch and the land owned by Mr Judd. Further works will be required and it is anticipated a further £1500.00 expenditure to complete the works.	
	Slightly ahead of schedule the works commenced which bought a significant level of concern and interest from local residents. Members of the Council and the Clerk received letters, emails and verbal communication expressing the shock of seeing a long standing hedgerow in part being removed.	

	Members of the Council acknowledged local concern, Cllr Turner followed up quickly by publishing an explanation as to why the coppicing works were underway reassuring everyone that measures were in place to plant saplings to fill the gaps. Permission to gain access to the hedge from the adjacent land was sought prior to the work commencing however there was a misunderstanding as to the extent of work required which required further communication with the land owner. The Council reflected on the necessity to regularly and consistently communicate locally and are currently preparing a Communication Strategy to support that ideal.	AT/AII
	Further development of the area & Village Hall entrance pond	
	The recent start to the coppicing of the large hedgerow has revealed significant gaping which members felt required the installation of soft visually pleasing fence. To be situated behind the hedging in order to stop access across the part open boundary. Cllrs (SM, JR,) to request quotes from local fencing specialist. Clerk to contact a third local contractor for a quote. It is hoped that with the planting of grass and flower seeds and new saplings the area will eventually create an easier hedgerow to maintain in the future. Members have also recently discussed reducing of overgrown vegetation at the pond at the Village Hall driveway entrance. It has become a health and safety issue as the visual splay for vehicles leaving the facilities do not have a good line of sight because of the trees and vegetation. Members were mindful that further removal of trees at this stage without prior notification would not be appropriate. Cllrs (SM & JR) to carry out a site visit to establish how much is intended to be removed and bring findings back to the Council.	SM, JR, Clerk SM, JR

	Members were more than happy to pursue the land acquisition using the skills and expertise within the Parish Council with Cllr Taylor taking the lead rather than further unnecessary expense of a Solicitors at this particular stage.	

Cllr Reed attended a recent meeting of the Sixpenny Handley Cricket Club held on 19th October @ Sports Pavilion. Notes of the meeting were taken and will be circulated to members after the FPC meeting.

Overall it was a positive meeting attended by several local cricketers along with the current Chairman Mr David Cross.

Members discussed the condition of the cricket square roller which has been out of action for a little while. Clerk to ask local contractor to assess the costs of cleaning and repairs.

Members also acknowledged the difficulties the Cricket Club have experienced during recent seasons unable to hold any matches and therefore attract income from subs or hire charges.

Members unanimously resolved to waiver this years' annual fees.

Cllr Taylor updated members on the current banking problems. Cllr Taylor & Turner who are current signatories and personal account holders with the Nat West Bank. Unfortunately, due to mistakes at source both members found themselves in the position where they could access all three accounts. In view of this error Cllr Turner & Taylor requested a resolution to remove them from the account.

Members **unanimously resolved** to be removed as signatories until further notice, with Cllrs New and Meaden being added to replace them.

Cllr Taylor circulated Unity Bank that specialise in community groups, subject to the appropriate due diligence the Council hope to open a new account.
