Dorset Council continue to campaign for customers of the telecom companies in the UK that are replacing fixed telephone networks (copper lines) with fibre. Age UK are assisting awareness campaign and customers who might require battery backup are encouraged to apply to providers. Concerns were raised that copper lines were already being shut down. Cllr Turner reminded members of the 'UK transition from analogue to digital land lines phones & what it means for Sixpenny Handley' in the January 2024 edition of the Downsman.

A total of £3.5 million has been spent on 25 new gritting vehicles, 10 of which are in use with 15 more on order for delivery ahead of this year's winter.

Questions raised by Parish Council members:

Q: Has Furzehill property been sold and if so has the capital been reinvested into other projects?

A: On 3/2/24 Dorset Council instructed the sale of Furzehill.

Q: Is there any news on County Farms?

A: DC are retaining them as there are no plans to sell off any assets.

Q: Is Dorset Council solvent?

A: There are pressures to find £44 million and DC have taken measures like harmonising and reinvestment of savings. Dorset Council's aim is to protect the essential frontline council services on which local residents and businesses rely. Throughout the life of this administration, and in contrast with a number of councils across the country, Dorset Council have set a balanced budget every year with no cuts to frontline services. Focus is on transforming highways, have more cost effective ideas and get overspends under control.

Action points: Report St Mary's Close poor road surface conditions directly to Highways portal.
